**NOTICE OF POTENTIAL DISCLOSURE OF PERSONAL
CONTACT INFORMATION**

TO: ALL PERSONS WHO WORKED AS "CVS" STORE MANAGERS IN CALIFORNIA AT ANY TIME ON OR AFTER MARCH 11, 2004: PLEASE READ THIS NOTICE CAREFULLY. IT CONCERNS THE POTENTIAL DISCLOSURE OF YOUR HOME ADDRESS AND TELEPHONE NUMBER TO THE ATTORNEYS WHO REPRESENT THE PLAINTIFF IN THIS PUTATIVE CLASS ACTION.

I. PURPOSE OF THIS NOTICE.

Douglas Mosse is a former Store Manager of a CVS drug store in California. On March 11, 2008, he filed a proposed class action on behalf of himself and a putative class consisting of all persons who worked as CVS Store Managers at any time on or after March 11, 2004.

In his lawsuit, Mr. Mosse is alleging that he and the other CVS Store Managers were deprived of overtime compensation, meal and rest breaks, and properly itemized wage statements. CVS denies these allegations and believes that it complied with the law. The court has not yet decided these issues and has not yet decided whether the case may proceed as a class action.

The attorneys representing Mr. Mosse and the putative class have requested that CVS provide them with the last-known home addresses and telephone numbers for all persons who are members of the proposed class. You have received this notice because records indicate that you may be such a person.

II. YOUR OPTIONS REGARDING DISCLOSURE OF YOUR CONTACT INFORMATION.

If you worked as a Store Manager of a CVS drug store at any time after March 11, 2004, you have three options regarding the disclosure of your contact information to the attorneys for Mr. Mosse. Your rights and the procedures to select an option are as follows:

A. Option One: You Can Do Nothing

If you do nothing, your last known address and telephone number **WILL BE PROVIDED** to the attorneys for Mr. Mosse. Please note, however, that even if this occurs, you are NOT obligated to speak to any attorneys.

B. Option Two: You Can Object to the Disclosure of Your Contact Information

IF YOU DO NOT WANT YOUR HOME ADDRESS AND TELEPHONE NUMBER DISCLOSED, YOU MAY OBJECT BY COMPLETING THE ENCLOSED POSTAGE PREPAID POSTCARD AND RETURNING IT TO THE CONTACT ADMINISTRATOR NO LATER THAN JANUARY 19, 2009. You must sign AND check the box on your objection for it to be valid. The date of delivery shall be, as applicable: (1) the date your objection is deposited in the U.S. mail, postage pre-paid, addressed to the Contact Administrator; (2) the date your objection is deposited with an overnight letter carrier; (3) the date your objection is personally delivered to the Contact Administrator; or (4) the date your objection is faxed to the Contact Administrator at (310) 348-0258.

C. Option Three: You May Contact Counsel for the Parties
