

SUBJECT: LEGAL NOTICE RE: Class Action COBURN v. STAMPS.COM INC. Los Angeles Superior Court Case No. BC353721

A proposed class action lawsuit is proceeding in Los Angeles Superior Court to recover the monthly service charges Stamps.com customers incurred due to their inability to terminate or close their Stamps.com accounts from June 9, 2002 to the present (the Class Period). This email has been authorized to be sent by the Superior Court.

The lawsuit alleges Stamps.com customers were required to cancel or close their accounts through telephone. However when they attempted to do so they were placed on hold for excessive wait times and their calls were never answered. As a result, customers were unable to cancel their accounts and continued to incur monthly fees. It is plaintiff's position that Stamps.com failure to provide a reasonable means for its customers to close or cancel their accounts during the trial period or thereafter constitutes an unfair business practice and is illegal.

Stamps.com refutes the allegations in the lawsuit, and denies that it has engaged in any unfair or illegal business practices.
