NOTICE PROGRAM

Pursuant to the Order of the Court and their Settlement Agreement, Class Plaintiffs and the
Mortuary Defendants have jointly applied for an Order approving the notice program for the
settlement between Class Plaintiffs and Mortuary Defendants.

This Court has carefully considered the propriety of the parties' proposed notice
program (the "Notice Program") and the proposed forms of notice (the "Notice" and the
"Summary Notice") for the class settlement.

Upon the pending motion for approval of the notice program, this Court, having read,
heard and considered all papers, pleadings, arguments and evidence submitted, and good
cause appearing therefor, now finds and orders as follows:

FINDINGS

1. The Notice provides a clear and full explanation of the settlement, the settlement process, and the rights of the class members, including a description of the settlement class, the settlement amount, the relief the settlement funds will provide class members, and informs class members that settlement class counsel will be seeking an award of attorneys' costs from the settlement fund.

2. The Notice describes the proposed settlement with enough specificity to allow class members to make an informed choice regarding whether to accept and participate in it.

3. The Notice provides a neutral, informative, and understandable description of the settlement agreement, and the rights of the settlement class members under the settlement agreement.

4. The Summary Notice provides a brief, clear summary of the settlement, and provides clear directions for obtaining additional information.

5. The Notice Program provides the "best practicable" notice of the proposed settlement, including direct mailing of the Notice to the settlement class members, publication of the Summary Notice in three local newspapers, publication of the Notice, and related materials on the Internet, distribution of the Notice at the cemetery, and a telephone number to provide the settlement class members with additional information regarding the settlement.

6. The Notice, Summary Notice, and Notice Program all meet the requirements for notice of a class action settlement. See *Bell v. American Title Insurance Co.*, 226 Cal.App.3d 1589 (1991); *Cartt v. Superior Court*, 50 Cal.App.3d 960 (1975).

GOOD CAUSE APPEARING THEREFOR,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED as follows:

1. The proposed Notice Program, including the proposed forms of the Notice and Summary Notice, is approved. Upon the parties' selection of the notice commencement date, the deadlines referenced in the Notice and Summary Notice shall be calculated in accordance with the settlement agreement and this Court's calendar.
